Application	<p>After nomination, coordinator will send softcopy of required documents via email (irdcmu@cmu.ac.th) by the deadline.</p> <p><u>Required Documents</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Application Form (Form 1) 2. Statement of purpose (1/2 – 1 page) 3. Official Academic transcript 4. Evidence of English language proficiency 5. Certificate of enrollment from the home university 6. Copy of valid passport (first page) 7. ID Photos 3*4 cm (formal photo: polite dress, light background, and neutral facial expression). 8. Medical Certificate issued within the last 6 months up to the date of application submission (Form 2) 9. Letter(s) of Recommendation (1 – 3 referees) 10. Application Check list (Form 3)
Visa application	<p>Once a student is accepted by the host faculty, the Acceptance Letter and Visa support package will be sent to the coordinator via email and postal mail for the student's visa application. Exchange students/researchers are REQUIRED to obtain their Non-Immigrant (ED) visa from a Royal Thai Embassy or a Royal Thai Consulate-General <u>before entering Thailand.</u></p>
Minimum Requirements	
GPA requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - 3.0 out of 4.0 or 2.3 out of 3.0 (for undergraduate level) - 3.25 out of 4.0 (for graduate level) - Remarks: The GPA criteria is flexible for the exchange student(s) depending on the Agreement or the consideration of the host faculty/program of the exchange student(s).
Language requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - TOEFL (paper based) 500 / (computer based) 173 / (iBT) 61 - IELTS 5 - TOEIC 600 - Remarks: The above mentioned minimum scores are flexible for the exchange student(s) (unless it is specially required in the Agreement). However, the students are still advised to provide any of the above mentioned English proficiency assessment reports or an equivalent internationally recognized English language test as a proof of their adequate English language skills to Chiang Mai University.

Pre-arrival	
Arrival date	Students should arrive at Chiang Mai University at least 1 week before the semester starts.
Insurance	Exchange students/researchers are highly recommended to purchase insurance at their home country BEFORE traveling to Chiang Mai.
Accommodation	The host faculty at Chiang Mai University is pleased to offer assistance in finding affordable and suitable off-campus accommodation for the exchange students/researchers.
Cost of living	
Meals	100 - 300 THB / day or approximately 3,000 - 9,000 THB / month
Accommodation	4,000 – 12,000 THB / month
