#### H. Fee Information

Potential Fees	Students are responsible for other personal expenses including: meals, housing, insurance, potential differential tuition, special class fees (e.g. computer, language, science lab fees, or other special class fees assessed for courses that require fees, such as business, engineering, physical education, etc.), books, local transportation, entertainment, etc. Students will be able to see the class or materials fee in the class details online during the registration process. (Meals and housing included in ISEP and Kansai Gaidai exchanges.)
	Some colleges on campus charge "differential tuition," which is a surcharge attached to certain classes. USU will pay an allowance of up to 6 credits of any undergraduate differential tuition for regular exchanges. If a student takes more than 6 credits worth of undergraduate differential tuition, the excess may be the responsibility of the student, except for students on Landscape Architecture and Environmental Planning and/or Business specific exchanges, who will be able to take 12 credits of differential tuition.
